

What's the TTF Watershed?

A watershed is all the land that drains into a body of water – for us, that's the 30 square mile Tookany/Tacony-Frankford Creek watershed. Tookany Creek begins in Montgomery County and flows into Philadelphia at Cheltenham Avenue where it's called Tacony Creek. When it reaches Juniata Park, the name changes again to Frankford Creek, which enters the Delaware River south of the Betsy Ross Bridge.

What is the TTF Watershed Partnership?

We connect communities to their creeks! Through education, stewardship, restoration and advocacy, we work with you and many others to improve the health of our watershed. We talk about water and how we can all make a difference on our blocks

and in our backyards. We invite Tacony Creek Park neighbors to plan and attend programs and join the TCP Keepers Friends Group.

What is the Tacony Creek Park and Trail?

By 1915, Tacony Creek Park was acquired as parkland to protect the creek. The park was once the site of several historic mills. With 300 acres of forests and meadows providing a home for wildlife, this green space contains a 3.2 mile paved walking and bicycling trail that connects under Roosevelt Boulevard. The trail can be reached through a number of neighborhood gateways.



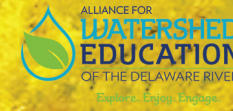

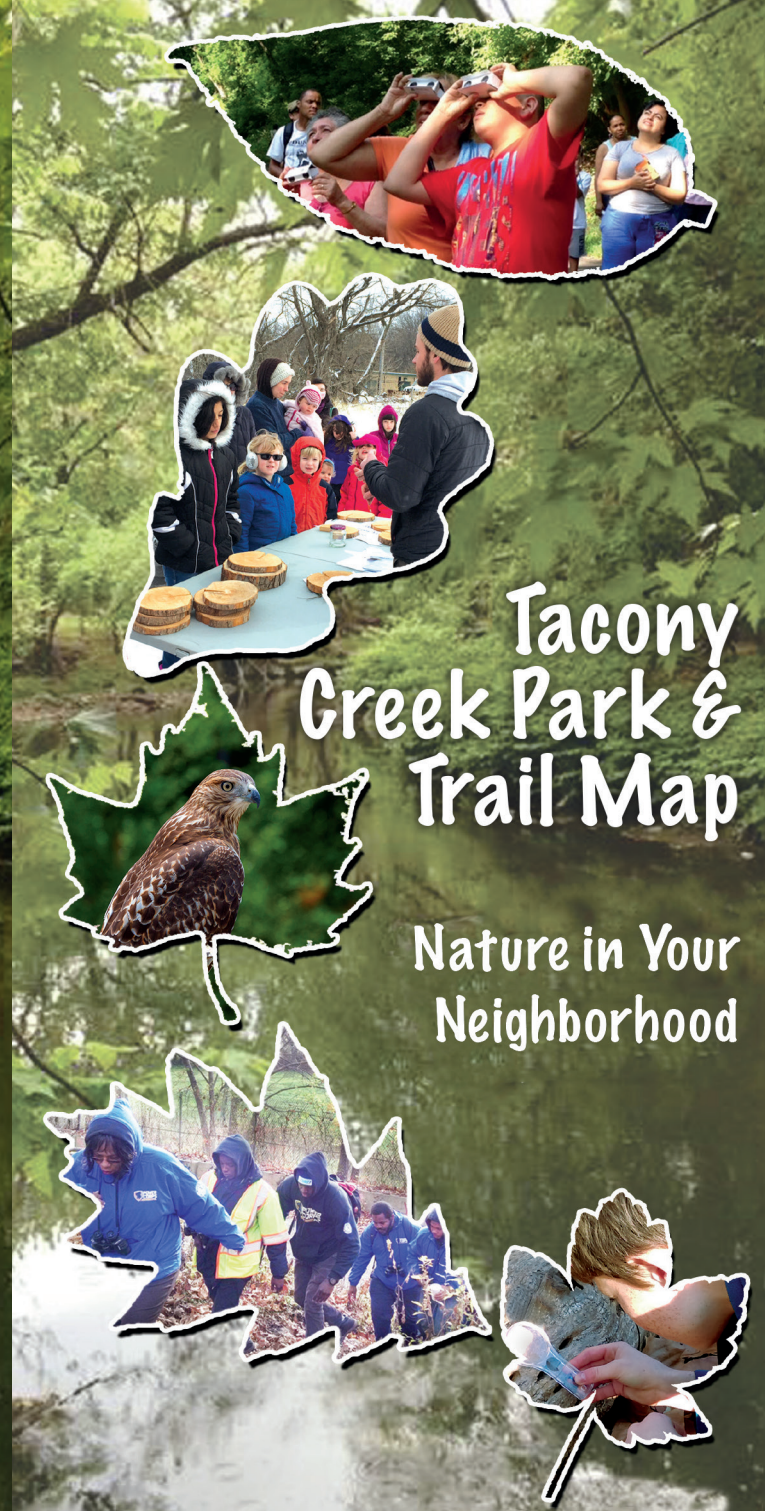
